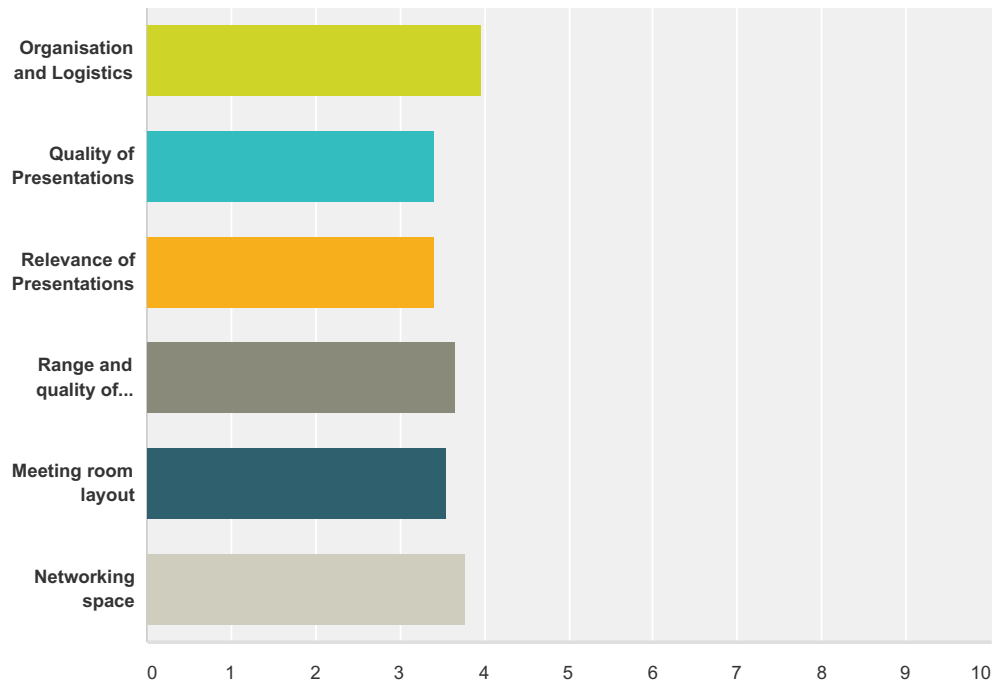

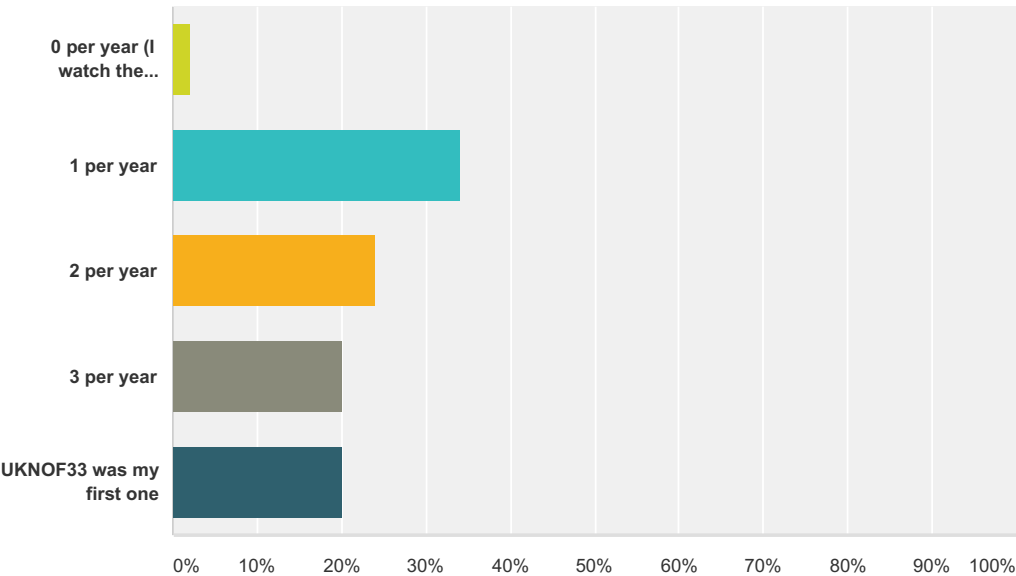

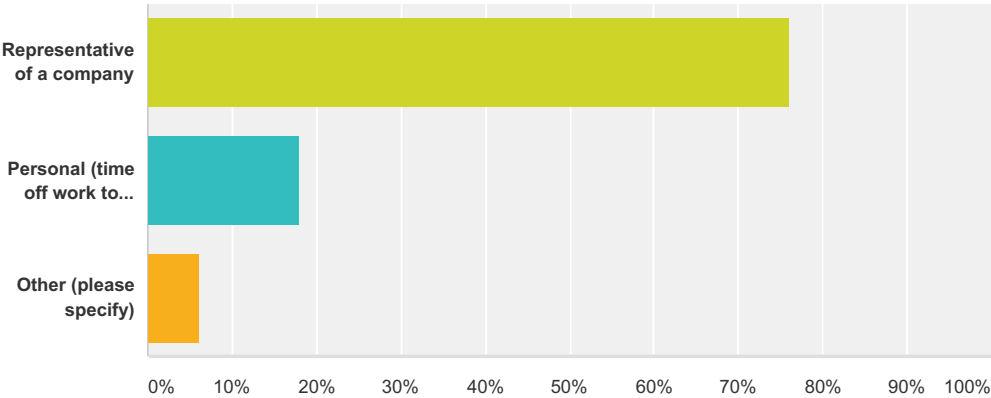

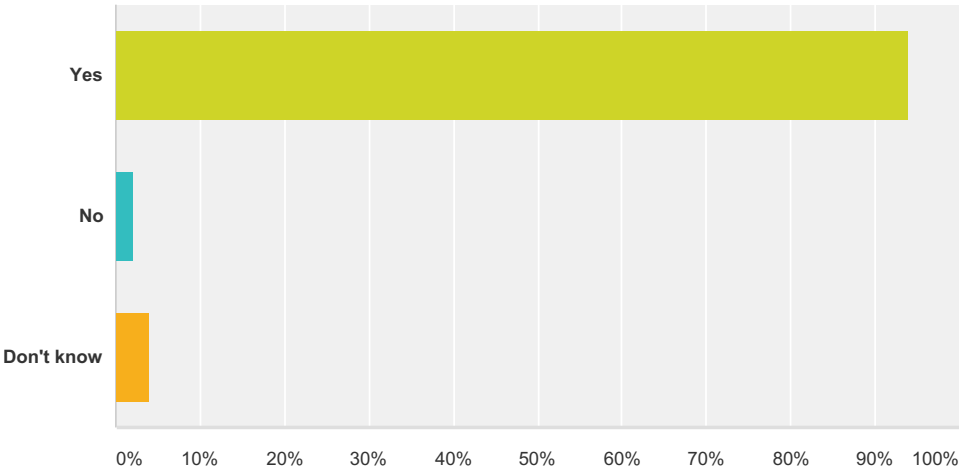

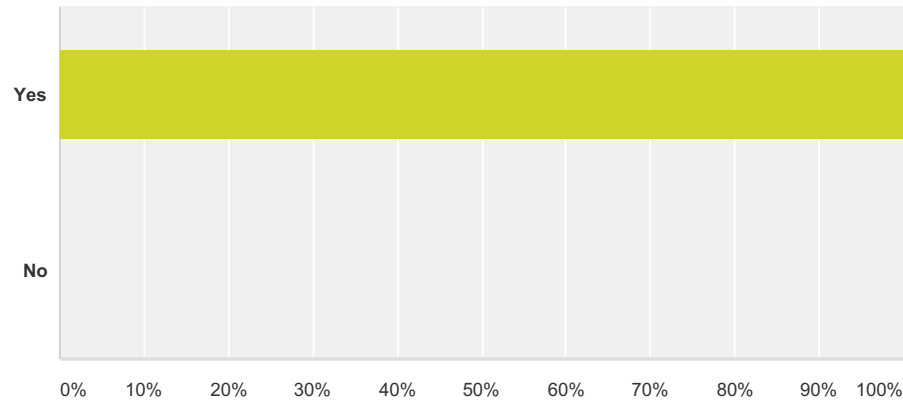

Q8 Would you recommend UKNOF meetings to others?

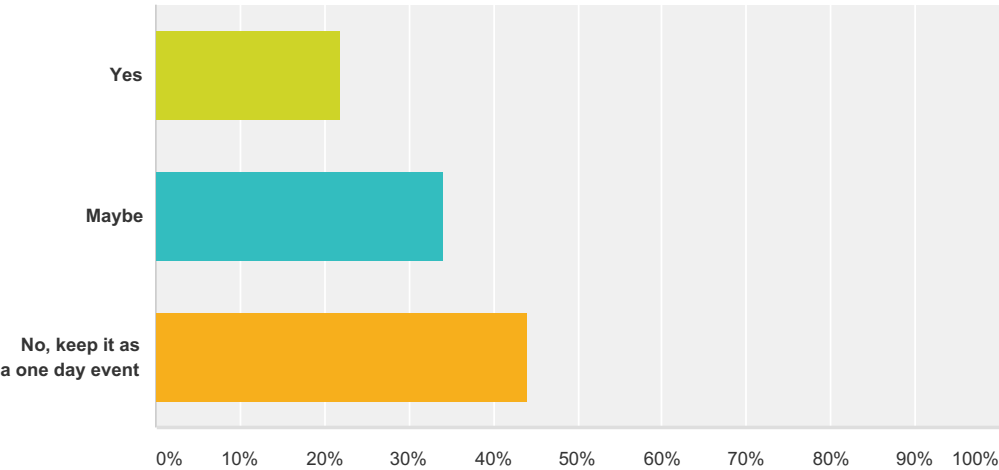

Q9 Would you attend a 1.5 days or 2 days long UKNOF-only meeting?

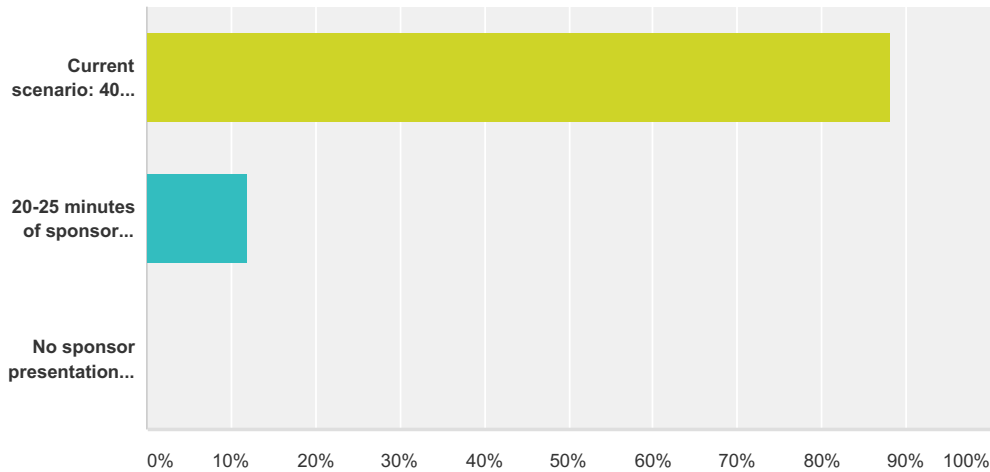

Q10 Which of the following would you prefer, to attend UKNOF?

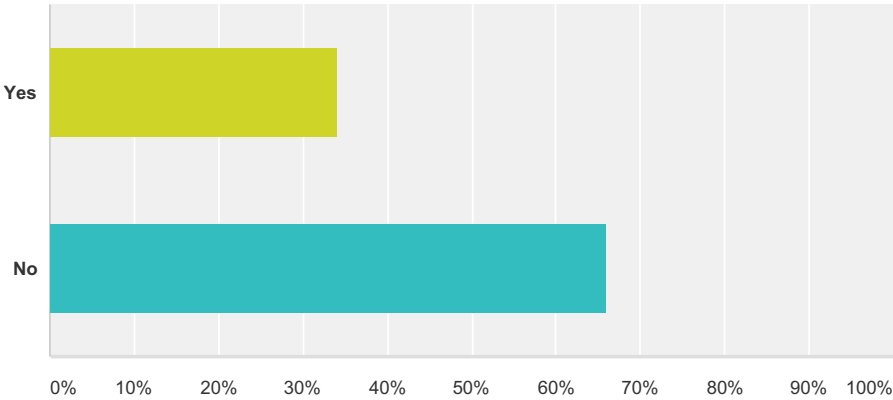

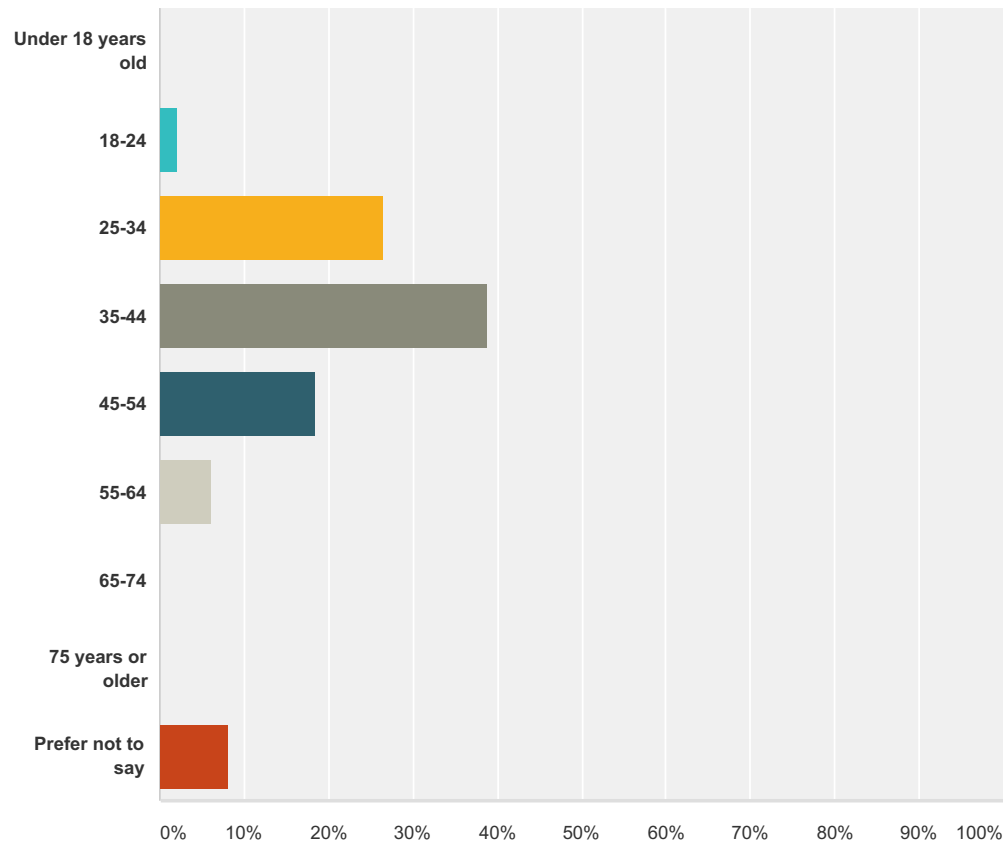
